Information for Parents, Carers and Students

Making the right option choices can determine what progression options are available after year 11. Entry to Sixth Form and some further education courses are based on the achievement of certain subjects and grades. As a guideline, further education at Level 3 requires the achievement of at least five GCSEs at grade 4 to 5 or above. There are a number of progression options for those who do not achieve their GCSEs first time; all further education college courses at Level 1 and 2 include the opportunity to re-take English and Maths if needed.

If you have a plan of the career and education route you wish to take then check what GCSE requirements are needed for entry onto the course of study. Please review the information detailed below which we hope will help answer some of the questions you may have.

Daventry Sixth Form



- The E-ACT Daventry Sixth Form offers a wide range of Level 3 programmes, including A Levels, BTEC and other vocational courses.
- The main difference between vocational courses and A Levels is that they are designed to relate to career routes and the work place, they are also largely internally assessed whereas A Levels are solely academic courses that are largely assessed through examination.
- Most universities will consider both A Levels and vocational courses when making offers to students. BTECs are highly regarded by universities although A Levels may be favoured by some Russell Group Universities.
